2022 Mini-Grant Project Request Form

The Pennsylvania Lake Management Society (PALMS), with funding from the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection, is pleased to be able to offer assistance to landowners, non-profits, county conservation districts and municipalities to address lake-related issues of critically eroded shorelines, excess nutrient loading, and aquatic invasive species that degrade the quality of lakes in the Commonwealth. Through this program, we are offering a limited number of grants on a competitive basis, up to \$24,000 each, to correct identified lake problems. Priority will be given to projects that a) propose to address watershed impairments identified in the Commonwealth's 303(d) list and b) plan to direct **at least 85%** of the funds to direct implementation costs.

Projects should address at least one of the following: Shoreline Restoration, Nutrient/Sedimentation Reduction or Control, and Invasive Species Management. All projects must include an educational and outreach component, some examples, but not limited to; workshops, project signage/kiosk, videos, handouts, etc. All printed material will need to be reviewed and approved by PALMS.

Eligible Projects:

-Shoreline Restoration, priority will be given to restoration activities that incorporate a minimum 50' "no mow" vegetated buffer.

-Activities that directly lead to nutrient or sediment reduction within the lake or reservoir -Aquatic Invasive Species Management, priority will be given to rapid response projects and species on the <u>PA Noxious Weed List</u>

Note: Eligible in-lake projects include but not limited to; lake aeration, phosphorus inactivation using alum or phoslock, and the control of non-native invasive aquatic vegetation using aquatic herbicides.

Ineligible Projects:

Design Studies Surveys Plan Development Maintenance Projects Dredging activities Algaecide Floating Vegetative Islands Algae control using sonar or sonic devices The use of short-term nutrient removal practices such as the installation of nutrient binding materials (e.g. biochar) in streams. * Ineligible project activities may be eligible to use as match/in-kind services.

Eligible applicants:

-Incorporated and insured watershed association or community association
-County, including county planning commission, or municipality
-County conservation district
-Municipal authority
-Council of governments
-Other authorized organization that is one of the following:
A ten ensure for ensurement of the section 501(a)(2) of the lateral Devenue (1996)

A tax-exempt corporation under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code and registered with the Pennsylvania Bureau of Charitable Organizations. If an applicant/sponsor is claiming an exemption from

registering with the Bureau of Charitable Organizations, the applicant/sponsor must provide proof of such exemption with the application. Conservation commissions or foundations created by state or federal legislation or action are exempt from the incorporation requirement.

(For organizations that do not fall under those eligibility requirements it is encouraged to partner with an eligible entity.)

The information you provide in this request form will help PALMS direct those limited resources to where they are most needed, so please complete this form in its entirety including attachments. Should any portion of this request be incomplete, PALMS reserves the right to reject the application. By completing this application and <u>initialing</u> on the line next to each item, you, the applicant, agree to the following terms:

1. ______ Applicant agrees to provide *rights of entry* through a signed Landowner/Grantee agreement to property for the purpose of assessment, prioritization, survey, design, and if selected, implementation, as well as future inspections of the project area by PALMS, Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection, or any agents/assigns of the named organization or agencies. (Please refer to the Landowner Agreement Form at the end of this document)

2. _____ Applicant will be responsible to provide a **minimum 25% match (cash or in-kind)** of the total cost of the project. A final signatory or commitment letter will be expected before funds can be released.

3. _____Applicant/Landowner (circle one) agrees to be the **permit applicant**, if needed. No funds will be released in the absence of any necessary permits.

4. _____ Applicant/Landowner (circle one) agrees to sign an **Operation and Maintenance Plan** for the life of the proposed project. (Please refer to the Operation and Maintenance Form at the end of this document)

5. _____ Applicant agrees to contact the Department of Labor for prevailing wage determination and provide documentation to PALMS.

6. _____ Applicant agrees that the majority (85% or more) of funds, if awarded, will be applied to direct implementation costs (e.g., construction materials and labor).

7. _____ Applicant agrees that the project will utilize BMP's from the <u>PALMS BMP manual</u>.

8. _____ Applicant understands that this is a **reimbursement-based grant** and that **only paid invoices marked with method of payment and the date paid will be reimbursed or counted as cash match**. Reimbursement time frame is dependent on DEP grant processing.

9. _____ Applicant acknowledges that the **project will be completed and a final report and reimbursement request will be submitted by October 1, 2023**. Reimbursements will not be issued for submissions past this date, <u>no exceptions</u>. The applicant must be the one submitting the final report and reimbursement.

General Conditions:

Completing and submitting this request form in no way guarantees that your project will be funded. If your project is selected for funding you will be required to enter into a contract with the Pennsylvania Lake Management Society (PALMS). In addition, if selected for funding you hereby accept and understand that this is a reimbursement-based grant and that only paid invoices marked with method of payment and the date paid will be accepted. You also understand that reimbursement for your submitted invoices can take 12 weeks or longer for reimbursement depending on turnaround from the Commonwealth's Comptroller Office. You also understand that your reimbursement request could be delayed should a budget impasse occur at the state

legislature. As part of the reimbursement request documentation must be provided of all cash and in-kind contributions to the project, to meet the 25% match minimum. Applicant acknowledges that 30% of the project cost will be withheld until the 25% match contribution has been satisfied.

Projects on Non-Grantee-Owned Lands
